By adding the scores on the nine questions you will generate a score between 0 and 27. All of those who score 8 or more out of 27 represent a 'problem gambler' and fall into the 'high risk' category (Referring to Gamblers who exhibit negative consequences and a possible loss of control).

Those who score between 3 and 7 represent 'moderate risk' gambling (Referring to Gamblers who experience a moderate level of problems leading to some negative consequences).

Those with scores of 1 or 2 represent 'low risk' gambling (Gamblers who experience a l ow level of problems with few or no identified negative consequences).
