Purpose of Job	Working under the direction of the Team Leader the post holder will play a pivotal role within our Lincolnshire Service enabling service users to build on their progress with the treatment services and develop their wider recovery capital and move towards a sustained recovery and independence. You will be an integral member of the Lincolnshire team delivering; bespoke recovery planning, assessments, beneficiary supervisions, reviews and personal development planning. You will work in a strengths-based way with a caseload of individuals to provide support and motivation around the aims and objectives set out within their Recovery and Personal Development Plans. The role requires the facilitation/delivery of a range of non-accredited personal development groups (training provided). The post holder will be responsible for the accurate and timely recording and inputting of client data in line with our contractual obligations. Your knowledge of our partner agencies, community organisations and recovery communities will ensure our beneficiaries benefit from the resources and opportunities available to them both locally and on-line. You will be a champion of abstinence-based Recovery and proactive in supporting the growth and profile of Recovery and Recovery Communities in Lincolnshire.
